Pre-Placement Evaluation Requirement

A comprehensive online placement evaluation must be completed prior to course registration or a student’s arrival on campus. This evaluation will determine the number of foundational courses required for the student’s program.

Assessment areas include:

- Music Theory
- Music History
- Ear Training
- Keyboard Proficiency
- Arranging
- English Writing

As part of the admissions process, some students may be required to complete remedial or foundational coursework based on the results of their placement evaluation. This may include undergraduate-level courses in areas such as music theory, keyboard proficiency, aural skills, or other subjects identified based on the individual student’s needs.

Students who do not pass one or more sections of the placement exam may be required to complete up to a maximum of two quarters (24 credit units) of foundational coursework. If the evaluation indicates that foundational courses are necessary, these courses must be successfully completed within the first two quarters in which they are offered.

Courses taken to satisfy foundational requirements are supplemental to the program and do not count toward Master of Music degree requirements. Credits earned for foundational coursework do not apply toward the total credits required for the graduate degree.

MI's campus also includes the Hollywood Passage, located at 6752 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, CA 90028, one half block East of Highland Avenue. Administration, Artist & Career Services, and Performance rooms are found in the Hollywood Passage.

Musicians Institute Hollywood classes are conducted in both the Main Building and in the Hollywood Passage. Main Building classrooms are designated with the prefix “MI,” and Hollywood Passage rooms are designated with the prefix “PASS.”

Most of MI's administrative offices are housed in the Hollywood Passage building, including Artist & Career Services, Student Support Center, Office of Academic Affairs, Registrar, Admissions, Financial Aid, Marketing, Accounting and Instructional and Information Technology Services. Human Resources is located on the first floor of the Main Building, behind the alley security desk. The Operations Department is located at the McCadden entrance.

Most of MI's administrative offices are housed in the main building, including Artist & Career Services, Student Billing, Office of Academic Affairs, Financial Aid, Marketing, Facilities, and Instructional and Information Technology Services. Admissions, Registrar, Student Services, and Student Affairs/International are located in the East bungalow in the Commons area. MI HOLLYWOOD COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BACH-BF.PL | Bass Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual-from fundamentals to advanced niche techniques; from personal topics of interest to preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-CF.PL | Composition Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lesson focused on developing and applying traditional and contemporary compositional techniques and skills. Includes analysis and critique of compositions and preparation for both scoring assignments and Sophomore and Senior projects. One lecture hour per week for one quarter.

BACH-DF.PL | Drum Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual-from fundamentals to advanced niche techniques; from personal topics of interest to preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-GF.PL | Guitar Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual-from fundamentals to advanced niche techniques; from personal topics of interest to preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-KF.PL | Keyboard Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual-from fundamentals to advanced niche techniques; from personal topics of interest to preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-SF.PL | Songwriting Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Fostering the development of students' "compositional voices" serves as the main objective within the Songwriting & Production lesson program. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-SXF.PL | BACHELOR SAXOPHONE PRIVATE LESSON | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual - from fundamentals to advanced techniques, as well as personal topics of interest and preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-TF.PL | BACHELOR TRUMPET PRIVATE LESSON | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual - from fundamentals to advanced techniques, as well as personal topics of interest and preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-TBF.PL | BACHELOR TROMBONE PRIVATE LESSON | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual - from fundamentals to advanced techniques, as well as personal topics of interest and preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-VF.PL | Vocal Foundational Private Lesson | Credits: 2.00

Weekly private lessons on student's primary instrument. Topics vary based on the needs of the individual-from fundamentals to advanced niche techniques; from personal topics of interest to preparation for juries and final projects. One private lesson hour per week per quarter.

BACH-010 | Notation and Writing Project 1 | Credits: 2.00

This course serves to reinforce skills needed to write and understand basic music notation and charts. This course will give students the ability to notate musical pieces. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

BACH-011 | Melodic Development/Chord Progression/ Transcription Study 1 | Credits: 2.00

This course serves to reinforce skills needed to compose basic chord progressions and melodies found in modern music. Weekly lectures will consist of teaching harmonic and melodic progressions where students will work on these skills during class with feedback from the instructor. A combination of transcription and analysis will provide students the skills necessary to compose and transcribe their own compositions. Four lecture hours per week for one quarter.

BACH-020 | Notation and Writing Project 2 | Credits: 2.00

Prerequisite: BACH-010 Notation and Writing Project 1. This course serves to reinforce skills needed to write and understand music notation and charts. This course will give students the ability to notate musical pieces and arrangements built on the skills learned in level 1. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

BACH-021 | Melodic Development/Chord Progression/ Transcription Study 2 | Credits: 4.00

Prerequisite: BACH-011 Melodic Development/Chord Progression/ Transcription Study 1. This course serves to reinforce skills needed to compose basic chord progressions and melodies found in modern music building on level 1. Weekly lectures will comprise of teaching more advanced harmonic and melodic progressions where students will work on these skills during class with feedback from the instructor. A combination of exercises, transcription and analysis will provide the students the skills to be able to compose and transcribe their own compositions. Four lecture hours per week for one quarter.

BACH-S012 | Introduction to Songwriting 1 | Credits 2.00

This course serves as an introduction to the basics of writing music. Forms such as ternary, theme and variations, rondo, and contemporary song structures are introduced. Monophonic, polyphonic, homophonic, and heterophonic textures will also be discussed. Essential background on the use of dynamics, register, tempo, and timbre will also be examined throughout the course. Homework will consist of weekly listening and composition assignments and basic score analysis. The course includes a midterm exam and a final project. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

BACH-S022 | Introduction to Songwriting 2 | Credits 2.00

Prerequisite: BACH-S012 Introduction to Songwriting 1. This course serves as a further introduction to the basics of writing music. Basic harmonies, harmonic functions, and cadences will be discussed. The circle of fifths and ideas for structuring melodies will also be discussed. Essential background on using non-chord tones in melodic writing and developing phrases will be introduced. Using timbre as a means of expression will also be examined throughout the course. Different styles of composition and songwriting will also be examined. Homework will consist of weekly listening and composition assignments and basic score analysis. The course includes a midterm exam and a final project. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

CC-048E | Chart Writing | Credits: 1.00

This course covers the basics of creating chord charts and lead sheets using notation software. Topics include chart categories, song structure, creating a road map, notating rhythm, chord nomenclature, notating melodies and lyrics, and full score vs parts. One hour per week for one quarter.

DRUM-157E | Chop Builders | Credits: 1.00

Prerequisite: DRUM-011 Drum Technique 011. This course is designed for intermediate to advanced drummers seeking to elevate their technical proficiency, speed, and control. Through structured weekly practice regimens, students will refine their hand and foot technique while developing an efficient, personalized practice routine. Topics include weak hand development, relaxed and efficient hand mechanics, stamina and stability training, roll and velocity development, dynamic control, advanced rudimental applications, and bass drum technique. Weekly in-class workouts and demonstrations will challenge students to push their limits while reinforcing relaxed, sustainable playing habits essential for high-level performance. One lecture hour per week for one quarter.

MM-P011 | Contemporary Arranging-RMM 1 | Credits: 2.00

This course is designed to quickly and intensively review concepts and techniques used in arranging, in a variety of contemporary styles. Topics covered will include writing for the rhythm section, score layout and standard notation practices, melodic analysis and embellishment, and writing for horns. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P021 | Contemporary Arranging-RMM 2 | Credits: 2.00

Prerequisite: MM-P011 Contemporary Arranging - RMM 1. This course is designed to quickly and intensively review concepts and techniques used in arranging, in a variety of contemporary styles. Topics covered will include writing for the rhythm section, score layout and standard notation practices, melodic analysis and embellishment, and writing for horns. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P012 | Graduate Theory Essentials 1 | Credits: 2.00

This course provides students with detailed instruction in the principles of 4-part writing and their application to diatonic triads and 7th chords. The course also teaches students about figured bass, modal interchange, modulation, and reharmonization. One lecture hour and two lab hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P022 | Graduate Theory Essentials 2 | Credits: 2.00

Prerequisite: MM-P012 Graduate Theory Essentials 1 or Placement Test. This course provides students with detailed instructions on the construction, analysis, resolution, and use of the Neapolitan and augmented sixth chord, chord extensions, and added note chords. The course also teaches students about using structures from the Baroque period to the 20th century period. One lecture hour and two lab hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P013 | Graduate Ear Training Essentials 1 | Credits: 1.00

This course covers aural recognition skills based on movable "Do" solfège including tonic voicings and chord-scale applications with a focus on Major key centers & Minor variations. Two lab hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P023 | Graduate Ear Training Essentials 2 | Credits: 1.00

Prerequisite: MM-P013 Graduate Ear Training Essentials 1. This course covers aural recognition skills based on movable "Do" solfège including tonic voicings and chord-scale applications with a focus on Modes. Two lab hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P014 | Graduate Keyboard Proficiency Workshop 1 | Credits: 1.00

This course introduces contemporary keyboard techniques and develops skills for successful keyboard performance and musical comprehension. Students will develop motor skills for using the keyboard as a performing and composition tool by studying physical posture, finger technique, diatonic scales, and chord progressions. One lecture hour per week for one quarter.

MM-P024 | Graduate Keyboard Proficiency Workshop 2 | Credits: 1.00

Prerequisite: MM-P014 Graduate Keyboard Proficiency Workshop 1. This is a degree-specific course for non-keyboard majors. Its focus is on performing pop and classical repertoire, as well as further study of chord progressions, scales, lead sheet interpretation, basic score reading, and outlining an arrangement. One lecture hour per week for one quarter.

MM-P015 | Preparatory Graduate Performance Techniques 1 | Credits: 2.00

Prerequisite: Placement Audition is required. This course is comprised of assigned student ensembles performing a new song each week, based on charts and recordings supplied by instructor, with an emphasis on stylistic accuracy and ensemble interplay. One ensemble hour per week for one quarter.

MM-P025 | Preparatory Graduate Performance Techniques 2 | Credits: 2.00

Prerequisite: MM-P015 Preparatory Graduate Performance Techniques 1 or Placement test. This course is comprised of assigned student ensembles performing a new song each week, based on charts and recordings supplied by instructor, with an emphasis on stylistic accuracy and ensemble interplay. One ensemble hour per week for one quarter.

MM-P016 | Foundations of Western Music History for Graduate Students | Credits: 2.00

This course provides master's students with a survey of Western Classical Music from the Middle Ages to the twenty-first century. This includes discussions of Gregorian Chant, the development of Western notation, prominent musical developments of the Renaissance, such as Madrigals and the Dodecachordon, and major developments of the Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and Contemporary eras. This includes discussions of prominent composers within each era and their contributions to developing practices and aesthetics relevant to twenty-first-century music. Furthermore, the class gives students an introduction to modern research methods and presentation skills that they will need to complete a master's thesis and defense at the end of their program. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.

MM-P017 | Foundations of American Popular Music History for Graduate Students | Credits: 2.00

This course provides an overview of the history of popular music in the United States in its many genres of expression and changes in the ways popular music has been presented and consumed, through text reading, lecture, research projects, and listening. Two lecture hours per week for one quarter.
